AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled: "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter Seventeen entitled: "Public Works" is hereby amended by striking out the present sub-section 17-80 (b) and substituting in place thereof a new sub-section 17-80 (b) to read as follows:

Section 17-80 Penalty.

(a) (unchanged)

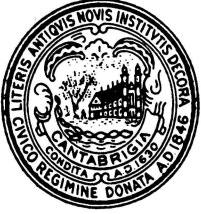
(b) Any person who violated any other section of this Article may be issued a NOTICE OF VIOLATION (appearance ticket). Said notice shall be returnable to the Clerk of the Third District Court of Eastern Middlesex located in Cambridge. Unless the person named on said NOTICE OF VIOLATION appears before said Clerk within twenty-one days of said violation either personally or through an agent duly authorized in writing or by mailing to such clerk, with the NOTICE the fine provided therein, a complaint will be sought against the person named on said NOTICE.


