Section 1.

Section One of Chapter Eighteen of
the Revised Ordinances is hereby am-
ended by inserting after the words
"Night Police" in the third line, the words
"Six Sergeants of Police".

Section 2.

Section Two of the same Chapter
is also hereby amended by inserting
after the words "per annum" in the
third line, the following, to wit: "that
of the Sergeants of Police shall be two
dollars and eighty seven and one half
cents per day".
