WHEREAS: The principles that the American Flag stands for were created by the experiences of a great people, said Woodrow Wilson many years ago.

WHEREAS: The Flag has grown and changed with the Nation. Everything that it represents is reflected in the lives of those who carried it, stood by it, served under it, or protected because of it.

The Flag, as we salute it today, is an emblem that evolved through various stages, varied designs, and assorted appearances. Again reflecting the growth and changes of the country, as well as its people.

WHEREAS: To commemorate the anniversary of its adoption on June 14, 1977, Congress has set aside the 21 days from Flag Day through Independence Day as a period to honor America.

WHEREAS: By displaying the national colors during this 21 day salute to America, we symbolize a united democracy through this badge of freedom and independence.

THEREFORE: By virtue of the powers vested in this office, I do hereby proclaim the twenty-one days, Flag Day through Independence Day, as a period to Honor America, that there be public gatherings and activities at which the people can celebrate and honor their country in an appropriate manner.
