- WHEREAS: It has been reported through the New York Times that a Cambridge architectural firm which has done work in the Cambridge School Department has been linked to the most expensive construction project in the history of New York, specifically the Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music and the Arts; and
- WHEREAS: After two decades of design and construction, the building is still beset with structural cracks, including a seriously inadequate ventilation system; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Superintendent of Schools to determine if any such structural problems exist in any school buildings which have had work done by this architectural firm.
