AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an Ordinance entitled: "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge"

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge are hereby amended by adding to Chapter 33 the following Article and Sections:

ARTICLE VIII.

CHARGES FOR SERVICES

Section 47. Charges for Collection of Ashes and Rubbish.

There shall be charged by the city for the collection of ashes, dust, sweepings, shrubbery clippings, tree branches and any other refuse, other than offal, the sum of \$.10 for each barrel, parcel, box, or other container in excess of two containers, except that no charge shall be made for the collection of such refuse from schools, churches, charitable or benevolent organizations, buildings used solely for private dwellings, and portions used for private dwelling in buildings other than hotels and other than buildings used solely for private dwellings.

The Superintendent of Streets shall keep suitable records of all collections for which charges are to be

made, as required by this Section and shall be charged with the collection of amounts due for such services at the time collections are made. The Superintendent is authorized to cause to be sold to occupants of real estate stubs or other tickets for the purpose of making payment and collection of amounts due for said services.

Section 48. Charges for Use of Dump and Incinerator.

The Superintendent of Streets is hereby empowered to issue permits for the dumping of rubbish in any dump owned or controlled by the city or at the incinerator now owned by the city or at any other incinerator hereafter operated by the city. The Superintendent shall establish rules and regulations for the conduct of such dumping, such rules and regulations to be approved by the City Manager. The charge for such permit shall be a minimum of \$.50 per load and a maximum of \$5.00 per load, the charge to be determined within said limits by the Superintendent, according to the size of each load. No person shall dump any refuse or rubbish in any dump owned or controlled by the city or in any incinerator owned or operated by the city without previously having obtained a permit therefor from the Superintendent of Streets.

Section 49. Penalty for violation.

Any person who violates either of the above sections shall be liable to a penalty of five dollars.

AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an Ordinance entitled:—"The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter 33, entitled "Streets and Sidewalks" Article VIII, Section 47. Charges for collection of Ashes and Rubbish, is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph and substituting in place thereof the following.

There shall be charged by the city for the collection of ashes, dust, sweepings, shrubbery clippings, tree branches and any other refuse, other than offal, the sum of \$.25 for each barrel, parcel, box, or other container in excess of two containers, but after four barrels or containers the sum of \$.40 per barrel or container, except that no charge shall be made for the collection of such refuse from schools, churches, charitable or benevolent organizations, buildings used solely for private dwellings, and portions used for private dwelling in buildings other than hotels and other than buildings used solely for private dwellings.
