

Whereas the Cambridge Hospital and the City of Cambridge and the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association have agreed to a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the renovation and expansion of the Hospital,

Whereas one of the primary purposes of the Memorandum is to address Hospital neighbors' interest in preserving the residential character of the area around the Hospital now and in the future,

Whereas representatives of the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association and the Hospital have had extensive discussions about the need for limits on Hospital growth as part of a good neighbor policy,

Whereas there is consensus between the MCNA and Hospital representatives that long-term limits on Hospital expansion in the area of the Cambridge Street facility are needed to reassure residents that the area will continue to be a viable residential neighborhood in the future and that these limits can be consistent with the Hospital's mission to provide health care,

Therefore be it resolved that the City Council is on record as endorsing the concept of enforceable, long-term agreements, between the City, its Hospital and the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association, to limit further Hospital expansion in the Mid-Cambridge area beyond the current project.
