Born November 1, 1919 in New York City, he was the son of Raymond W. Lewis M.D., and Alice (Cragin) Lewis. He grew up in Riverdale, New York, and graduated from Deerfield Academy in 1937 and from Williams College in 1941. From 1941 to 1942 he worked as an editorial assistant to Reader's Digest. During World War II, he served on a destroyer in the Pacific Theatre of Operations as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy. He came to Williams in 1942 as an associate director of alumni relations and the following year, the positions were split and he served as director of alumni relations from 1975 to 1986. He helped plan the 1993 as a member of the Bicentennial Commissions and edited the popular Williams 1793-1993: A Pictorial History. In 1986, then President Francis C. Oakley, awarded Lewis the Rogers Cup, the college's highest honor for alumni service. Mr. Lewis was known for his exceptional attention to detail, a trait developed over the 28 years that he had served as editor of the magazine Medical Economics, for which he also wrote hundreds of articles. His civic involvement included service on the Board of Governors of Hackensack (N.J.) Hospital from 1966 to 1974 and on the board of the Williams Club of New York. Locally he was active in the land preservation movement, particularly with the Williamstown Rural Lands Foundation. He had served on the foundation's board since 1990 and as its clerk secretary since 1992. He had donated a conservation restriction on his property to a conservation road where it joined other conservation properties. He leaves his wife, Mary (Mink) Lewis; two sisters Mary Lewis Wang of Saint Louis and Alta Lewis Homan of Walnut Creek, California; four nephews and one niece Scott Lewis Pennington of South Burlington, Vt., Gordon William Pennington of Portland, Oregon, Penelope Wang Baltz of New York City, Dorothy Cragin Wang of Boston, and R.
