We, a group of concerned Cambridge women, heartily applaud your courageous effort to prevent the Arthur Little Company from experimenting with nerve gases until the City had a chance to verify the absolute safety of the operation. (In fact we would prefer no such experiments in our city no matter how safe they might seem to be.)

To us it seems arrogant for A.D.L. to have set up its laboratory without first consulting the City Council. In addition, the conduct of the A.D.L. representative in their appearance before the Council, as reported in the Chronicle, was offensively arrogant. We do not believe that Arthur D. Little himself, the founder of the company, would ever have been so insensitive to the opinion and interests of the citizens of Cambridge.
