Francis Hederman, 81, served Patton in WWII

Francis J. Hederman of Cambridge, a veteran who served under Gen. Patton, died Sunday at Youville Hospital in Cambridge. He was 81.

Born in Chicopee Falls, Mr. Hederman was raised and educated there. He was a resident of Arlington for 10 years and Cambridge for 70 years.

Mr. Hederman was employed as a factory worker at Boston Woven Hose.

Mr. Hederman was a World War II Army veteran where, as a member of Gen. George S. Patton's Third

Army, he was awarded the Purple Heart.

Husband of the late Marion C. (Kelley), Mr. Hederman is survived by a daughter, Marion E. Gaulin of Orlando, Fla.; two brothers, William of Billerica and Paul of Norwell; nine grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated tomorrow at 9 a.m. at St. John's Church, Cambridge.

Burial will be in Cambridge Cemetery.
