- WHEREAS: To gain respect both as a competent professional within the mission of healing and as a compassionate human being whose very person conveys a message of healing is a marvelous mix which is found in Doctor John Tobias Nagurney who is leaving The Cambridge Hospital to become Attending Physician in the Emergency Room Department at the Massachusetts General Hospital; and
- WHEREAS: From the day in 1979 when he began his association with The Cambridge Hospital as attending part-time physician in the Primary Care Unit, through his tenure as Medical Director of the Windsor Street Neighborhood Health Center from 1981-1983, and as Director of Emergency Room Services at The Cambridge Hospital from 1983 through the present, Dr. Nagurney has always made sure that he was present where he was needed and when he was needed; and
- WHEREAS: Among his accomplishments for which the people of Cambridge can be grateful were his updating of policy so that physicians would provide full-time coverage in the Emergency Room as well as his guidance of the development and incorporation of pre-hospital care in conjunction with the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The following words from the Hippocratic Oath administered to medical graduates in many universities are clearly reflected in the work of Dr. Nagurney:

" You do solemnly swear...that you will be loyal to the profession of medicine and just and generous to its members; that you will lead your lives and practice your art in uprightness and honor..."
