WHEREAS: A federal law mandates that senior citizen developments house a certain percentage of people with disability regardless of age. This mandate also covers people with active substance abuse problems; and

WHEREAS: Many senior citizens are complaining this law has a negative impact on the quality of life in these developments; and

WHEREAS: Many senior advocates have notified the appropriate federal agency; and

WHEREAS: No resolution to this problem has been forthcoming; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager conduct a survey of all Cambridge senior citizen housing under the control of the City to determine what recommendations the seniors would make to resolve this problem and then to form a task force consisting of the City Manager, Assistant City Manager for Human Resources and the Executive Director of the Housing Authority to present a petition to Congressman Joseph P. Kennedy, III so that he can commence appropriate action in addition to any present action being considered.

In City Council November 1, 1993.

Adopted by the affirmative vote of nine members.
