He grew up between Davenport, Iowa and Chicago, Illinois and then moved with his mother to Paris, France for two years. When he returned to the states, he came to Massachusetts where he finished high school, and went on to Northeastern University to earn a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1930.

He was a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity for over fifty years, and most of his adult life.

He married the late Anna R. Plummer in 1932 and from this union they had three children, Madlyn Johnson and Joseph A. Patterson of Cambridge and Patricia A. Owens of Abington. The loving grandfather of five and great grandfather of one.

He leaves behind a loving family and many friends, for he was a good and generous man.

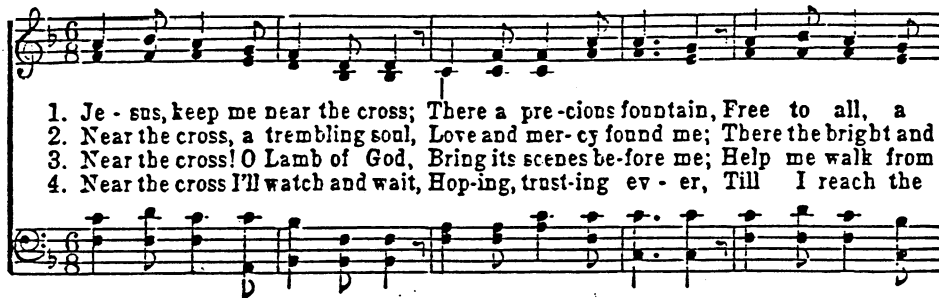
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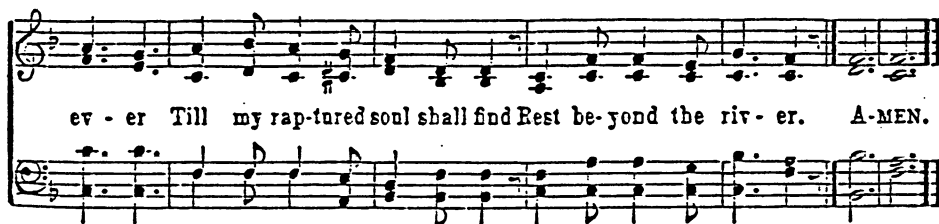
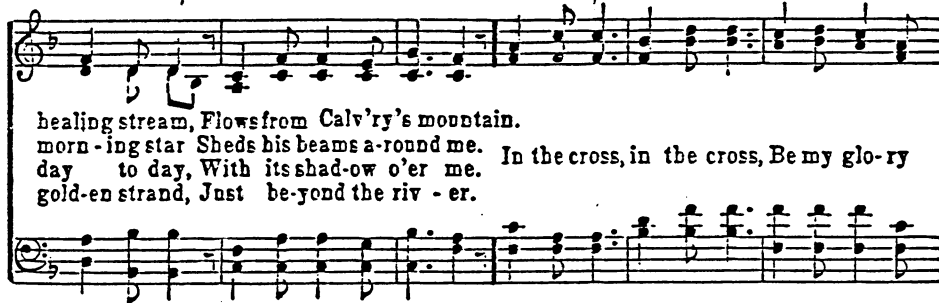
