

Chapter 618.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy

AN ACT FURTHER EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN CAMBRIDGE, ARLINGTON AND BELMONT TO THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 491 of the acts of 1951 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 74 and in line 76, the word "twenty", inserted by chapter 441 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof, in each instance, the word:- thirty.
