Cellucci in vetoes expected in budget

Cellucci may target education, health

When Governor Paul Cellucci unveils his budget vetoes this afternoon at an Auburn senior center, he will announce cuts of \$175 million that seem designed to avoid a repeat of the political turmoil that embarrassed him last year.

The vetoes, the biggest of which will hit education and health care, will trim the \$21.55 billion budget to a level that nearly matches the fiscal 2001 spending plan that Cellucci submitted in January.

But the cuts, according to sources, will not touch a \$187 million increase in local education aid, a politically sensitive outlay that the Republican governor unsuccessfully tried to slash in 1999.

The proposed increase is \$55 million greater than the amount required under the 1993 Education Reform Act. When Cellucci vetoed \$94 million in extra school funding last year, the resulting firestorm engulfed members of his party who joined Democrats to hand him his most deflating political defeat of the year.

The governor, however, plans to cut \$45 million from a variety of education programs, including a series of what one aide called "boutique programs" earmarked for certain legislative districts.

JFK Library Foundation names ambassador CEO

Officials at the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation named US Ambassador John Shattuck as chief executive officer of the foundation yesterday.

Shattuck, a former vice president at Harvard who also served as assistant secretary of state under President Clinton, will take the reins of the the non-profit foundation in January, just after he completes his term as the US ambassador to the Czech Republic.

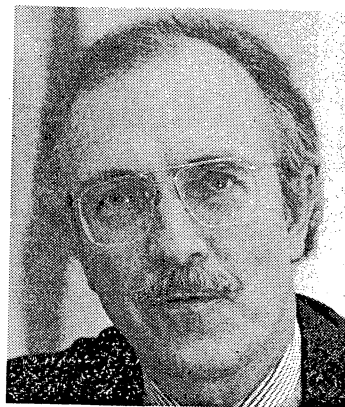
His appointment ends a six-month search to replace Charles U. Daly, the Kennedy Library Foundation's current CEO. Daly, who spent 12 years leading the library and museum dedicated to the nation's 35th president, is retiring.

Shattuck said he plans to use the library to spur discussions and host forums on public service, international human rights issues and other topics of particular interest to Boston residents, such as education, he said.

"My whole career has been in the public sector ... a lot of that comes from my exposure to the ideas of President Kennedy," Shattuck said in a telephone interview from the Czech Republic yesterday.

"Today we need to pass this on to new generations of students and people who didn't have direct knowledge of President Kennedy, but nonetheless see the value of what he stood for."

Shattuck was chosen by a

search committee that included Kennedy's daughter, Caroline Kennedy Schlossberg, her husband, Ed Schlossberg, and Senator Edward M. Kennedy. Foundation officials noted Shattuck's work in government service and in the nonprofit sector, a career that spans nearly three decades.

As the assistant secretary of state from 1993 to 1998, Shattuck helped negotiate an end to the war in Bosnia and helped negotiate the Dayton Peace agreement. His works netted him the International Human Rights Award from the United Nations Association of Boston in 1998.

Daly, the current CEO, said he was pleased with Shattuck's appointment.

"He is the sort of person President Kennedy himself would have recruited to guide this marvelous living memorial in the new century," he said.
