

Katherine Stacey of Cambridge, 82, former teacher

Katherine F. Stacey of Cambridge and Green Harbor, a teacher and reading consultant at the Longfellow School in Cambridge for 40 years, died Wednesday at Cambridge Hospital after a brief illness. She was 82.

A lifelong Cambridge resi-

dent, she attended Wellington Elementary School and Cambridge Latin High School. Miss Stacey received her bachelor of arts degree from Framingham Teachers College and her master's degree in education from Boston University in 1952.

For 40 years, she taught first and second grade at the Longfellow School, where she also served as a reading consultant. Miss Stacey retired in 1979.

She was a member of the Cambridge Teachers Association, the Massachusetts Teachers Association, and Pi Lambda Theta, a national honor society for women in education. She was also a supporter of the Boston Catholic Television Center.

She is survived by two sisters, Grace R. and Alice L., both of Cambridge.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Miss Stacey at 10 a.m. tomorrow in St. Mary's Church, Norfolk Street, Cambridge.

Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery, Malden.
