WHEREAS:

In a communication from the Mayor he has called the attention of the City Council to the death of Hon. Charles J. McIntire one of our best known and respected citizens, it is fitting and proper that suitable action be taken as a tribute of respect to his memory.

Charles J. McIntire was born in Cambridge and has resided here practically all his life. As a young man he left his studies at Harvard College and enlisted in Company G of the 44th Massachusetts Regiment and saw service during the greater part of the Civil War. He was admitted to the Bar in 1865 and has been an outstanding figure in his chosen profession since that time. He served as City Solicitor, Assistant District Attorney and for over a quarter of a century as Judge of the Probate Court. He was a member of the Common Council, Board of Aldermen and served in the Massachusetts State Legislature.

That we hereby record the public loss sustained in the death of Charles J. McIntire. The faithful and conspicuous service he rendered the City, County, State and Nation is hereby acknowledged and we gladly commend as worthy of imitation the example of good citizenship he showed during his life time in our city.

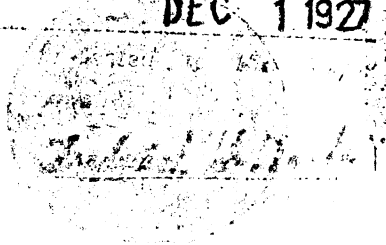

To the Honorable, the City Council:

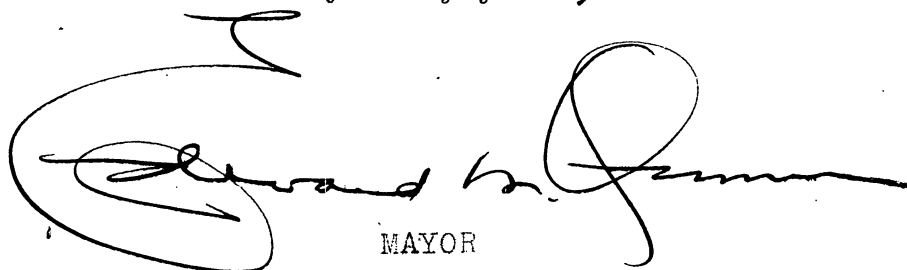
This will officially call your attention to the death of Honorable Charles J. McIntire which occurred in this City on Saturday, November 12, 1927.

For a number of years Mr. McIntire served the City in various capacities. During the years of 1866 and 1867 he was a member of the Common Council and in 1877 he was a member of the Board of Aldermen. During the years of 1871 and 1872 he was a member of the School Committee. He also represented a district of Cambridge in the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 1869 and 1870. For many years, ending his term of service in 1893, he was the City Solicitor. Later he was appointed by the Governor to the high position of Judge of Probate which honorable position he held until his resignation a few years ago.

In all of his activities Judge McIntire rendered faithful and honorable services to both the City and Commonwealth.

I respectfully recommend that suitable action be taken by your honorable board as a tribute of respect to his memory and in which tribute I shall gladly join.

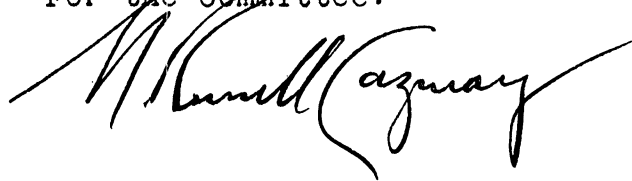
