John A. Jones was the son of the late Pleasant and Helen (Church) Jones. Born March 28, 1924 in Cambridge, Massachusetts. He was educated in the Cambridge School System, graduated from Cambridge High and Latin. John was drafted in the U.S. Army. He was promoted to Captain in the U.S. Army. He served for four years. After completing his service career, he attended Durnham University in New Hampshire, graduated with top honors.

John is the great nephew of the late Frederick Douglas.

John married Jane Jones, they were blessed with five beautiful children, John A. Jones II, Janet, Jacquelyn, (a son and daughter deceased). He was a member of the Actors Screen Guild. He has a series of Tarzan pictures and many credits. His last picture was the Planet of the Apes, he starred as an astronaut. He is a ^{former} member of the William G. Butler Masonic Lodge, founded by his grandfather the late John J. Jones October 12, 1921.

John returned to Cambridge Massachusetts after his acting career. He taught Drama at Emerson College in Boston. He also worked for the middlesex county in Waltham Massachusetts. He was a very conscientious person, and well liked by all of his friends.

As chairwoman of Headstart Inc. and the Headstart Policy Council, parent coordinator and then social service director of CEOC's Cambridge Headstart, she touched the lives of thousands of parents and their children. Dotty Lee was best known as an inexhaustible, compassionate and uncompromising activist and advocate for those in need, especially the poor and the homeless.

She was a founding member of the Cambridgeport Alliance, the Woodrow Wilson Tenant Council, the Health Stations Policy Council, the Cambridge Coalition for Child Care and Communities Acting Together, the precursor to the Civilian Review Board.

Dotty Lee was an executive officer of many organizations, including the Cambridgeport Planning Team, the CEOC Board, the Statewide Parents Association and the Local Council for Children. As regional vice-president of the National Parent Federation (1973-74), she planned and coordinated the Massachusetts Statewide Child Care Conference. For many years, she was president of the Woodrow Wilson Tenant Council and a member of the Public Housing Tenant Senate, always advocating for tenant rights.

She leaves her son, Rodney; her mother and father, Margaret and Michael Welby of Somerville; three sisters, Teresa Lenkner and Margaret Wehler of California, and Mary McCarthy of Somerville.

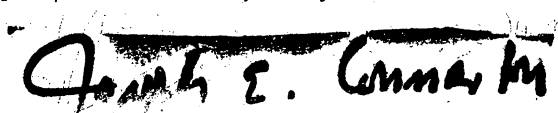
