WHEREAS: On May 26th, 1999 at 12:00 noon on the steps of Cambridge City Hall, the Bicycle Safety Bumper Sticker Award Ceremony will take place; and

WHEREAS: This event is to recognize the three winners of the Bicycle Safety Bumper Sticker Contest organized by the Community Development Department and School Department; and

WHEREAS: This contest was organized as the result of a council order submitted by Councillor Sheila Russell, and of the more than 200 bumper stickers submitted, three were chosen as winners, with the overall winner's entry turned into a bumper sticker; and

WHEREAS: The winners of the contest are as follows: Kaileigh Callendar, 5th Grade, Haggerty School, "Bike at Night - Be Bright"; Jen Dowd, 8th Grade, Fitzgerald School, "Wear Your Helmet, Fix it Right, Tighten the Strap, Then Ride Your Bike"; Sabrina Mahmood, 6th Grade, Fitzgerald School, "Everybody in the World Wears a Helmet; Do You?!"; and

WHEREAS: At the event, all three winners will be presented with bicycles provided by the Police Department and the new bumper sticker design will be given out as part of the Commute a Better Way Day event that is happening the same day; and

WHEREAS: Kaileigh Callendar's entry was chosen as the final bumper sticker design -- with the final language being "Biking at Night? - Be Bright"; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its appreciation to the Community Development Department and the School Department for engaging the City's youth in a great bicycle safety education event; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record acknowledging all those who participated in the Bicycle Safety Bumper Sticker Contest and congratulating Kaileigh Callendar, Jen Dowd and Sabrina Mahmood on winning the contest; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the winners of the Bicycle Safety Bumper Sticker Contest on behalf of the entire City Council.

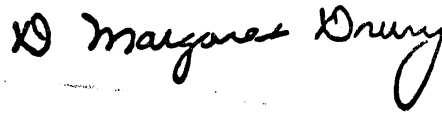

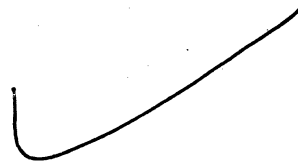
