William Floyd Weld is a native of Long Island, New York, and is presently a resident of 28 Fayerweather Street.

Bill Weld attended the Middlesex School graduating first in his class in 1962.

Bill Weld attended Harvard College graduating summa cum laude in Classics in 1966. Weld also gave his class latin address.

After Harvard Weld attended University College, Oxford University as a Knox Fellow earning a Diploma with Distinction in Economics in 1967.

After Oxford Weld attended Harvard Law School graduating cum laude and clerked on the SJC. Other legal jobs included being an associateship at Hill and Barlow, assistant counsel to the Watergate hearings, an unsuccessful run for Attorney General in 1978 winning only the towns of Dover and Mount Washington, appointment as U.S. Attorney by President Reagan, Head of the Criminal Justice Bureau for Attorney General Edwin Meese, and until his election as Governor, Partner at ~~Ropes and Gray~~, State Street Boston.
