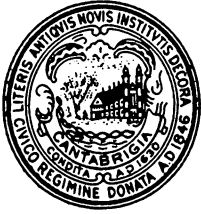

Subject Delayed Refunds on Motor Vehicle Excise Tax.

This responds to an inquiry by the City Council, on May 23, 1977, regarding delays in the issuance of refunds on motor vehicle excise taxes.

It is true that a very unfortunate situation was uncovered in January of this year. In the course of installing new procedures, we discovered 1,046 unexecuted refunds. These refunds, covering the years 1974, 1975, and 1976, amounted to \$29,091.88.

I am happy to report, at this time, that refund checks have been issued on all these accounts and that I attached a note of apology for our laxity to each check. Further, we have taken steps to make sure such a situation does not reoccur.

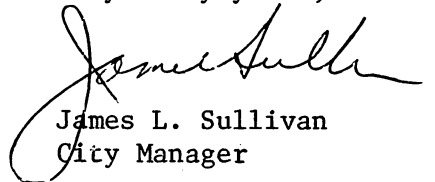
