COUNCILLOR DUEHAY

- WHEREAS: There have been continued acts of violence perpetrated against parking control officers while they are carrying out their duties in Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Chapter 265 Section 13D of the Massachusetts General Laws provides for punishment by imprisonment of not less than ninety days nor more than two and one-half years or by a fine of not less than five hundred nor more than five thousand dollars against any individual who is convicted of assault and battery against certain categories of public employee; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Law Department to draw up a proposed amendment to this section of the General Laws adding the category of "parking control officer" to the group of public employees so protected; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to advise the City Council as to whether a home rule petition would be a more effective way of achieving this objective.
