COUNCILLOR SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: A veteran politician, businessman and journalist, Andrew P. Quigley, passed away on May 25, 1990 at the age of sixty-four; and
- WHEREAS: Andrew, the youngest son of eleven term Chelsea Mayor, Lawrence F. Quigley, served his country as a member of the United States Navy during World War II and was one of the first witnesses to step among the ruins of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, Japan in 1945; and
- WHEREAS: At age twenty-two Andrew was elected to serve in the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 1948 and to the Massachusetts Senate in 1950, representing Chelsea, Revere, Winthrop and Everett and while representing his district the people of Chelsea elected him Mayor in 1951 serving several years in that dual capacity; and
- WHEREAS: Andrew in addition to being an outstanding politician was an accomplished businessman and journalist, having purchased the weekly Winthrop Transcript in 1949 and consolidating it in 1959 with the Winthrop Sun, he also purchased several other newspapers in the area, as well as having founded the East Boston Sunday Transcript in 1983; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout his journalistic career he never lost touch with the people or politics of Chelsea having first been elected to the School Committee in 1961 serving in that capacity up to the time of his death; and
- WHEREAS: During his long tenure on the School Committee, Andrew was instrumental in implementing several major educational reforms including conceiving the so-called "Chelsea-B.U. Plan" which provided for Boston University to manage the Chelsea public school system; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Andrew's brother, John L., his four sons, Andrew, Jr., Stephen, Kevin and Lawrence and to the entire family at the loss of such a fine public servant and journalist; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Clerk.

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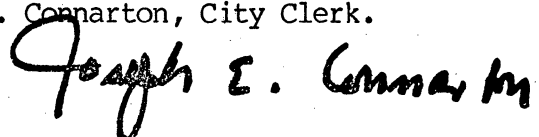
