

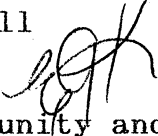

SUBJECT: Tobin Neighborhood Council

As you are aware, the Tobin Neighborhood Coordinator resigned his position in December 1989, at a time when programs were in full operation.

During the four and a half months when the position remained vacant, several residents who are active on the Tobin Neighborhood Council volunteered their time and worked diligently to maintain programs. The net result of their efforts was the continuation of quality programs and services for all residents.

I am respectfully requesting a City Council order recognizing the efforts of the following Tobin Neighborhood Council Members:

Joanne Moynihan: Council Chairperson, Joanne has been responsible for all aspects of program development for the Tobin Community School Program including hiring of teachers, development of spring programs, promotional materials, and supervision of part time staff.

Jonathan Seth Miller: Treasurer, Jonathan has helped to resolve the financial deficit at the Tobin Community School by developing an impressive system to provide financial stability for council programs. Jonathan also assisted Joanne with program development and promotional material. He has been instrumental in advocating for space at the Tobin School.
