Sister of late speaker 'Tip' O'Neill

Mary (O'Neill) Mulcahy, the former principal of the Haggerty School in Cambridge, died Tuesday in New England Rehabilitation Hospital in Woburn. She was 93.

Mrs. Mulcahy was the sister of the late House Speaker Thomas P. "Tip" O'Neill Jr.

A lifelong resident of Cambridge, she graduated from Lowell State College and was employed by the Cambridge public schools for 46 years.

She leaves two sisters-in-law and several nieces and newphews.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. Monday in St. John Church in Cambridge. Burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery in Boston.
