

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight-hundred and sixty.

An Ordinance in relation to watering streets.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Sec. 1. Whenever any appropriation of money shall have been made by the City Council for watering streets, no part of said appropriation shall be expended except by order of the Committee on Watering Streets, and upon a warrant drawn by the clerk and upon the City Treasurer and duly countersigned by the Auditor.

Sec. 2. Such sum only shall be paid for watering any street as shall be equal to the amount subscribed by persons residing on said street.

Sec. 3. The Committee on Watering Streets shall, in all cases, make the contract with some suitable person, or persons, for watering any street or streets, when an amount equal to one half the expense thereof shall

first have been subscribed and paid into the hands of the Chairman of said Committee, but no money shall be paid from said appropriation for any watering not done in pursuance of a contract so made.

Sec. 4 The subscription or payment of any sum by any Railroad Company shall not authorize the payment of an equal amount from said appropriation unless the sum so subscribed and paid shall be applied for watering that portion of the street not occupied by the Railroad tracks.
