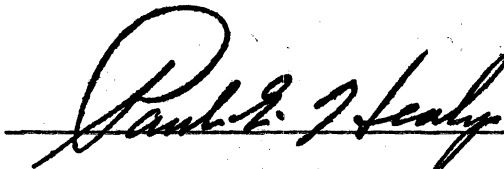
COUNCILLOR CLINTON

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Middlesex County Superior Court Officer Curwood Kanouse, a Cambridge resident, was stricken with a heart attack on November 29, 1984 in front of the Courthouse while entering the building; and
- WHEREAS: An unknown individual ran into the building to alert Middlesex County Police Officer William Coughlin that a man had collapsed outside; and
- WHEREAS: Officer Coughlin immediately went to Mr. Kanouse, and upon determining through his emergency medical training that he had taken a heart attack, Officer Coughlin performed mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on Mr. Kanouse, and by so doing, kept him alive until Fire Rescue came with additional assistance and transported Mr. Kanouse to the hospital; and
- WHEREAS: Officer Coughlin performed professionally and his prompt and efficient action resulted in reviving Court Officer Kanouse; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere gratitude to Middlesex County Police Officer William Coughlin for his prompt "call to duty" in an effort to save a human life; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Officer Coughlin on behalf of the entire City Council.
