WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that Oak street, from Cambridge street to the Somerville line, should be laid out as a public street or way, in accordance with a plan drawn by E. F. Bowker, dated Nov. 8, 1883; and that Plymouth street, between Winsor and Hampshire streets and Webster avenue, should be laid out as a public street or way, in accordance with a plan drawn by Charlss D. Elliott, dated Sept. 1876.

Ordered, That due notice be given to the abutters on said Oak and Plymouth streets; and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to lay out the streets before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as public streets; and that MONDAY, the 7th day of May next, at 8 o'clock, p.m., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made there-to.
