- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge Public Health Department, the Cambridge Police Department, the Cambridge Public Schools and the Community Development Department have joined together with parents to teach our children about the health benefits of walking and to remind motorists of their responsibility for the safety of our children; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council officially declares **Wednesday, October 6, 1999** "Walk Our Children to School Day" in the City of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council calls on all citizens to help provide a safe, enjoyable and healthy environment for our city's children who walk every day on their way to school or the bus stop.

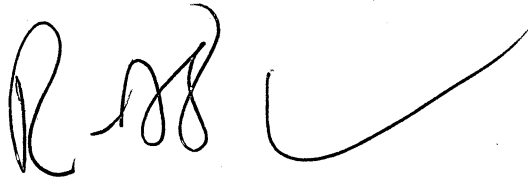
