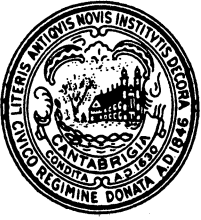
Subject City Council Order #2 of Nov. 6, 1978 "Parking Time Limit on Huron Ave."

The Traffic and Parking Department has been involved in the problem of parking on Huron Ave., with a view towards eliminating non-residents from parking in the residential areas and at the same time trying to assist the businesses located on Huron Ave. in the vicinity of Standish Street and Concord Avenue.

We have at the present time posted the business area in the vicinity of Standish Street with a two hour parking limit. This was done after many meetings with the business community. The residential areas on Huron Ave. between Concord Avenue and Fayerweather Street will be posted the first week in December for resident parking and we will then continue posting the other residential areas of Huron Ave.

It is our opinion that this will solve most of the non-resident parking in the area but we will be watching and making studies to insure that we do not put anyone out of business.

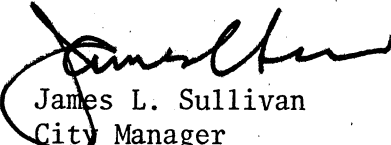
