Whereas Cambridge Youth Hockey and the varsity and junior varsity hockey teams at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School have struggled over the last several years to expand recreational and competitive opportunities for all Cambridge Youth; and

Whereas proposals now before the Metropolitan District Commission threaten the very existence of these programs; now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Cambridge City Council:

1. Oppose the 38% rate increase that will raise the cost of renting ice for each youth hockey team from \$750 to \$1035 per month;
2. Favor the exemption of non-profit youth groups and high school skating groups from any MDC rate increase;
3. Goes on record in support of restoring the maintenance budget for our neglected Gore Street Rink. Thousands of dollars are wasted by Cambridge youth teams by our School Committee renting ice at other facilities due to MDC delays in repairing the rink. A compressor which has been ordered is in storage because there must be a new contract to install it. Bleachers, a concession stand, and a skate rental will increase public use of the rink, increasing revenue from admission fees;
4. Goes on record as urging the Gore Street Rink to stay open until April, 1989 and to open it shortly after Labor Day next fall because Cambridge already has one of the shortest rink seasons and smallest staffs in the entire MDC system.

Be it further resolved that the City Manager be and hereby is requested to give special attention to meeting with the MDC until these issues are satisfactorily resolved; and

Be it further resolved that our legislative delegation be informed of the wishes of Cambridge parents and the vote of this City Council in this regard;

Be it further resolved that Representatives Flaherty, Vellucci, and Thompson; and Senators LoPresti, Barrett, and Kraus be informed of the city's deep concern and that they be urged to intervene with the MDC so that this hockey program can continue.
