Biography

Shoshana Pakciarz is the Executive Director of Project Bread, a non-profit organization dedicated to helping the hungry in Massachusetts. Project Bread supports over 100 emergency feeding programs across the state and leads a network of over 6,000 individuals and organizations working in the public policy arena to end childhood hunger in Massachusetts. Project Bread also sponsors the Walk for Hunger, the largest one day hunger fundraiser in the country and the largest annual walkathon in the world. This year the Walk raised millions of dollars for the hungry through the efforts of the 47,000 walkers and 400,000 contributors who participated in the event.

Ms. Pakciarz came to Project Bread from the United Way of Massachusetts Bay where she served as Assistant Vice-President of Allocations and Executive Associate of Strategic Planning. Prior to her position at the United Way, she worked for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Office for Children where she held the positions of Area Director and of Regional Director of Community Development.

Born in Argentina, Ms. Pakciarz managed a national agency providing after-school activities for children and youth. She moved with her family to a kibbutz in Israel, where she managed all extra-curricular activities for youth and coordinated the delivery of social services. She subsequently worked for a national agency editing a quarterly publication on social policy and developing a nationwide curriculum for after-school activities. Ms. Pakciarz moved to the United States in 1971.

Ms. Pakciarz graduated Summa Cum Laude with an A.B. in psychology from the University of Massachusetts and earned a Master's Degree from the Harvard University Graduate School of Education with a concentration in administration, planning and social policy.

In her 14 years as Executive Director at Project Bread, Ms. Pakciarz's vision, leadership and strategic development have been instrumental in increasing participation in the Walk for Hunger by almost 400% and in tripling the annual budget, thereby enabling Project Bread to increase the number of agencies funded from 175 to the over 100 served today. The qualities that Ms. Pakciarz has brought to the organization have also been instrumental in the emergence of Project Bread as a leader in the public policy arena, leading to the release of the first statewide study on childhood hunger ever done in the nation, major increases in state funding for child nutrition programs, and the passage in Massachusetts of landmark legislation to address childhood hunger.

Ms. Pakciarz's contributions have been publicly recognized numerous times by a variety of organizations, including the Sanctity of Life award from Brandeis University, the Distinguished Citizen award from the Boy Scouts of America, the Third Lantern award from the Rotary Club of Boston, and the Extraordinary Women of Achievement award from the YWCA.
