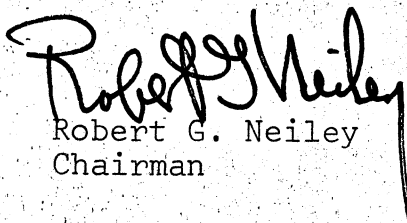

CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS

CASE 46

The Cambridge Historical Commission hereby certifies, pursuant to the Massachusetts Historic Districts Act and the Cambridge Historical Commission ordinance, upon application of William H. Crocker, City Electrician, on behalf of the City of Cambridge, with respect to Longfellow Park, in the Longfellow Historic District, that the following will be appropriate:

installation in the lower level of Longfellow Park of four lights at locations specified in the plan submitted to the Cambridge Historical Commission on June 7, 1974, and shown to Commission members and the public present at an on-site inspection, June 10, 1974; the fixtures to be as described in the letter from William H. Crocker, City Electrician, accompanying the June 7 plan, and conforming with existing fixtures in the Park; the lights to be removed or relocated as necessary to comply with any plan for a permanent park lighting system which may be approved by the Commission at a future date.
