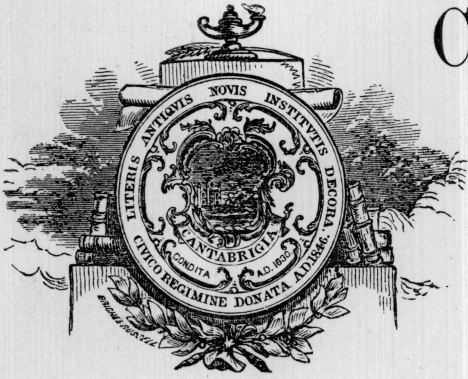

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Oxford Street
from Everett St. to the Somerville line

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

Fifty feet in width between

Said Everett St. and the
Somerville line

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

City Engineer

J. L. Chase

on file in the office of the City Engineer
and now ~~before this Board~~, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid.

And that thirty days be allowed for the removal
of fences and other obstructions standing on the
land so taken as aforesaid,
