Dear Members of the City Council:

Unfortunately, a prior commitment made it impossible for me to attend tonight's City Council meeting regarding discussion of the Planning Board's contemplation of litigation with the Board of Zoning Appeal over the granting of Variances for a proposed project at 2225 Massachusetts Ave. (corner of Mass. Ave. and Day St.).

As a resident of 4 Day Street for 45 years, I am appalled and outraged to think that a project that has been studied, reviewed, and revised over a 3 year period in order to satisfy the issues and needs of abutters, neighbors, and the North Cambridge Community, would be opposed by the Planning Board and Community Development Department after the Board of Zoning Appeal granted the Variances and Permits necessary for the project to go forward.

Finally, I think the idea that taxpayer money should be used to permit one City Board or Department to litigate with another City Board or Department is wasteful and without merit.
