

CHAPTER 3. ADVERTISING.¹

Sec. 3-1. Projections over streets;² permit; fee.

No sign, advertising device, clock, marquee, barber pole, stationary or movable, permanent awning or other like structures, projecting into or placed on or over the public highway a distance of more than six (6) inches, except poles, wires, conduits and appurtenances of telegraph and telephone, water, gas, electric light, heat and power companies and public transportation authorities shall be placed or maintained in any public way until a permit therefor has been granted by the City Council. The permit shall be issued by the Superintendent of Streets and the fee shall be One (\$1.00) Dollar. (G.O. 1943, Ch.30, §1.)
