WHEREAS: Ed Roberts, life long Cambridge Resident, and avid bowler, has recently joined the highest echelon of international amateur bowling by becoming the oldest member of Team USA; and

WHEREAS: Ed edged out many younger opponents in the national finals in Bloomington, Minnesota in August where he maintained a place in the top five all the way until he injured his wrist and dropped to eighth; and

WHEREAS: In the 48th game of the matched play, he needed a double strike to make top six, and upon making that double strike, received accolades from the audience for an "old guy, beating on the kids"; and

WHEREAS: Like most New England Bowlers in their 50s, Ed was a Candlepin bowler exclusively until the Boston Bowl in Dorchester introduced the tenpin sport to the Greater Boston area in 1959; and

WHEREAS: Ed has been the New England Collegiate Champion, and the winner of three New England Bowlers Association titles, and is looking forward to bowling in several national and international competitions in the coming months, and also looks forward to the day when bowling is finally accepted as an Olympic sport; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as congratulating Ed Roberts for having made Team USA, and wish him well in his future competitions.
