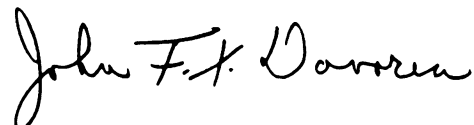

I. This corporation is organized for charitable and educational purposes pursuant to Section 501 c (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any future U.S. Internal Revenue Law.

The corporation will provide educational services and disseminate information in a wholly nonpartisan manner relating to various social issues affecting children.

II. In furtherance of the foregoing charitable and educational propose, the corporation may:

- a) disseminate information regarding conferences and issues to the public at large or to organizations interested in children,
- b) to hold workshops and classes on children's issues
- c) plan and arrange conferences at various places inviting expert speakers,
- d) prepare position papers,
- e) encourage effective public programs relating to children,
- f) conduct public discussion groups, forums, panels, lectures or similar porgrams,
- g) compile a directory of children's services and organizations
- h) prepare a newsletter for dissemination to the general public,
- i) do other lawful things in furtherance of the charitable and educational purposes which may be permitted by 501 (c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code and the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, each as now enforced or hereafter amended.

III. The Corporation shall not be operated for profit, and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, director, officer of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation affecting one or more of its purposes); and no member, director, officer of the Corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

IV. The following additional provision not inconsistent with the purpose of the Corporation are hereby established for the furtherance of the activities of the Corporation.

- a) The Corporation may apply for, solicit and receive from any source or sources outright in trust or otherwise by gift, demise, bequest or otherwise and hold cash, securities, real and personal property to the extent allowed by law and consistent with IRS code 501 (c) 3 status.
- b) The Corporation may retain, may buy or otherwise acquire, may renovate, improve, sell, lease, convey or otherwise dispose of, and may invest and re-invest its assets in, any property whether real or personal, within or without Massachusetts including without limitation any stock, obligations, or other securities of the corporation, association or business trust, investment trust or investment company, provided that none of the assets of the corporation shall be given or loaned directly or indirectly to any Director or member.
- c) The Corporation may make contributions for the accomplishment of its purposes, in such amounts as the Directors determine to be reasonable, to corporations, trusts, funds, foundations or community chests created or organized in the U.S. or in any territory or possession thereof, and organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes, no part of the net earnings of which inures or is payable to or for the net earnings of which inures or is payable to or for the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and which does not participate or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. It is intended that the organizations described herein shall be entitled to exemption from federal income tax under Section 501 (C) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as now in force or hereafter amended. The Corporation may also make contributions to carry out the purposes of this Corporation to states, territories or possessions of the United States or the District of Columbia, but only for exclusively public purposes.
