WHEREAS: Governor Weld has submitted his FY94 budget, H. 1. In the portion for the Councils on Aging, known as Formula Grant, \$1.70 is allotted for each senior. Cambridge Council on Aging has joined with other councils in the Commonwealth urging the legislators to restore the level to \$2.30 per elder (as was in 1987). Cambridge Council on Aging had to eliminate its Volunteer Coordinator position because of this cut in Formula Grants. All COAs have continued to play their valuable roles in the state elder service provider network with multi-year cuts; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby notifies its legislative delegation and Governor Weld that it favors restoring the level of the formula grant from the Governor's recommended \$1.70 per senior citizen to \$2.30 per senior citizen.
