WHEREAS: Suggestions have been made that the City may be able to argue that "technically" it does not need to go through the "Determination of Need" process; and

WHEREAS: Many residents of both Cambridge and Somerville have expressed numerous concerns about the need and the size of the expansion and will have to live with the impact of expansion for many years to come; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That it is the sense of the City Council that the City must not circumvent public input by finding "technical" ways of avoiding any approvals, including the "Determination of Need", and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to actively pursue such approvals so that the residents of both Cambridge and Somerville are assured that the project is fully and legally approved by all levels of government.
