

City of Cambridge,

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy Three,

An Ordinance in relation to the Water Works,

As it is ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge as follows,

Sect. 1. Chapter 29 of the Revised Ordinances is hereby amended by striking out the 21st section thereof, and inserting the following in its place:
"Section 21. The Water Board shall have the power to decide what shall be considered a waste or improper use of water, and to restrict the use thereof when it may deem it necessary; and if the water taker shall refuse or neglect to comply with any order of the Board, after notice given to him, the water may be cut off, and shall not again be let on except by a vote of the Board, and the payment of such fine, not exceeding ten dollars, as said Board may impose."

Sect. 2. The 23^d section of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out the words "For all purposes not enumerated in the foregoing rates, three cents for each one hundred gallons

shall be charged, the quantity to be ascertained by meter" and inserting the following words, "Manufacturers and other parties supplied with water through meters, or by estimated quantity, shall be charged at the rate of three cents per one hundred gallons." and by adding the following clause at the end of the paragraph, "When water is required for purposes which are not specified in the foregoing tariff, the rate shall be fixed by the Water Board,

Act. 3.

This Ordinance shall take effect as of the first day of July in the year eighteen hundred and seventy three,
