In reply to your Council Order No. 4, regarding the dumpster at the Public Works Garage on Hampshire Street, we are in agreement much of the uses of this dumpster is by non-Cambridge residents. However, this dumpster has a capacity of 6 cubic yards and is dumped at least two, and sometimes as many as three or four times each day, including weekends.

Prior to placing the dumpster in front of the Public Works Garage, the same rubbish was discarded along the public way near litter baskets, especially in the squares. I am in agreement that the dumpster has caused some problems, but the benefits provided exceed the problems.

I am, in addition as part of the rebuilding program at the Public Works Department, planning to screen this dumpster with a cedar fence and provide landscaping, shrubbery and trees around the front entrance, this will further reduce problems associated with it.

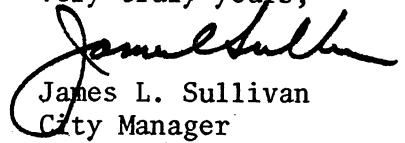
