WHEREAS a great many citizens and residents of the City of Cambridge depend on the service of the Metropolitan Transit Authority as a means of transportation; and

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Metropolitan Transit Authority have terminated, and do not provide transportation service on the Granite Street - Central Square bus line on Sundays and holidays; and

WHEREAS the City Council of Cambridge deems that bus service should be provided and restored by the Metropolitan Transit Authority on the Granite Street - Central Square bus line on Sundays and holidays as a matter of public convenience and necessity.

Be it RESOLVED:

That the City of Cambridge and the Cambridge City Council favors passage of House Bill, No. 1150, relative to providing service by the Metropolitan Transit Authority on the Granite Street - Central Square bus line in the City of Cambridge on Sundays and holidays; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Cambridge City Council herein urges the Chairman and the members of the House Committee on Ways and Means to take favorable action on said House Bill, No. 1150; and be it further

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the members of the General Court representing the people of the City of Cambridge, to the Chairman of the House Committee on Ways and Means, and to His Excellency, the Governor of the Commonwealth.

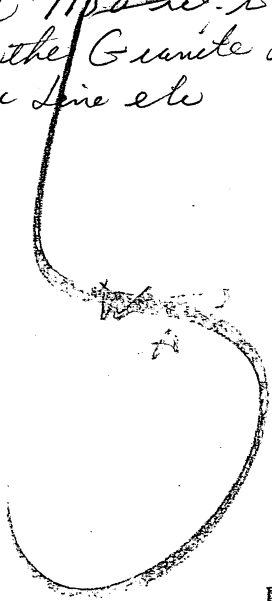
