The Massachusetts Institute of Technology has now completed and turned over to the Cambridge Housing Authority the final 304 apartments in a \$17 million dollar housing program, and

WHEREAS:

This program has provided a total of 684 new homes for the elderly citizens of the City of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:

This program was started some four years ago by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology to help ease a critical housing shortage in Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:

In May of 1971, the Department of Housing and Urban Development presented Massachusetts Institute of Technology with the Federal Turnkey Award for "the largest Turnkey Public Housing Development in the nation" and "the first Turnkey Project ever to be sponsored by an educational institution," therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record extending our sincere thanks and appreciation to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology for all they have done for the citizens of Cambridge and for their continued support for our various programs currently underway.
