MRH Volunteer Services, Inc.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To promote and advance the morale and welfare of patients recuperating in the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Hospital at 125 Nashua Street, Boston, Massachusetts, in ways approved by the governing authorities of the Hospital; to receive contributions from whatever sources, in trust or otherwise, and whether unrestricted or for designated purposes; to contribute from any unrestricted funds, principal or income, to projects which will benefit patients generally, but particularly the indigent and welfare, which would improve their morale and contribute to their happiness; and to any other act or thing which may seem necessary or advisable in connection with the foregoing purposes; to have and exercise all the powers conferred by and to carry on any other activities permitted by Chapter 180 of the General Laws; provided, however, that this corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes, no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, and no substantial part of its activities shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, or participating in any political campaign.

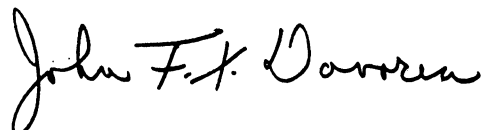
