To The Honorable, The City Council:

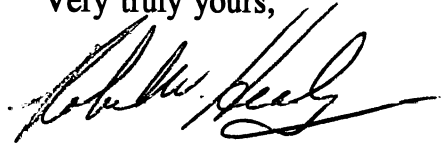
Attached please find an order requesting the acceptance and appropriation of a Grant for \$54,000.00 from the Massachusetts Committee on Criminal Justice to the Police Department Salary & Wages Account \$17,400.00 and Other Ordinary Maintenance Account \$36,000.00. This is the third year the City has received this Grant and its goals & objectives are as follows:

- Decrease the level of drug activity by increasing the level of enforcement;
- Arrest and displace drug dealers from Housing Authority property and surrounding streets;
- Improve investigation ability through the use of state of the art surveillance equipment;
- Train and certify recently assigned and new Narcotics Detectives;
- Increase enforcement of drug laws in and around schools;
- Meet with the residents at Community Group meetings in order to determine the full extent of the drug problem and work out cooperative strategies to solve it;
- Conduct informational meetings with Housing Authority managers to educate them on drug awareness and illegal activities in their housing complexes;
- Target specific areas of the city for aggressive drug enforcement by Narcotics Detectives and uniform police officers;
- Hire a Northeastern University Co-op student to maintain files and enhance case management by utilizing the computer system purchased last year with grant funds. This allows for less down time and increases detectives field availability;
- Place suspects arrested for a second drug offense in the District Attorney's Priority Prosecution Program; and

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- Eliminate the 2-3 day period presently required to compare, confirm, and receive suspect information from local and other New England law enforcement agencies.
