- WHEREAS: The City of Lynn on Saturday, November 28, 1981 was the scene of a major conflagration, destroying seventeen separate buildings and displacing hundreds of residents from their homes, as well as from their jobs; and
- WHEREAS: Once the call for "Mutual Aid" was sounded, our Fire Department responded by sending not only the usual three Engine Companies and a Ladder Unit, but with an additional three Engine Companies and Aerial Tower 1; and
- WHEREAS: This specialized apparatus was requested by Lynn Fire Chief Joseph Scanlan and a guarantee received from Metro that Cambridge would and did get other coverage, the request was subsequently granted by Cambridge Fire Chief Daniel J. Reagan who, with the cooperation of the personnel in Fire Alarm sent assistance to the beleaguered City of Lynn and remained in that City on active fire duty for twenty-four hours; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its hearty and sincere congratulations to Chief Reagan, the Fire Alarm personnel and most importantly, all of the Firefighters who responded to this devastating fire and worked so tirelessly on behalf of the residents of Lynn; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Chief Daniel J. Reagan to be read at all roll calls and included in each Firefighter's personnel file.
