- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Dimitri d'Arbeloff, late Chairman of the Board of Millipore Corporation of Bedford and long time Cambridge resident; and
- WHEREAS: Dimitri, born in Paris, France in 1929, later immigrated to this country with his parents in 1943, settling in Greenwich, Connecticut where he attended local schools and later came to Cambridge to attend Harvard University, graduating in 1951 and he received a Master of Business Administration degree from the Harvard Business School in 1955; and
- WHEREAS: Dimitri, along with Professor Paul Cherington founded and became President of United Research Incorporated, a firm which had contracts for government and private high-tech research, and in 1962 he joined the Millipore Corporation as Vice-President for International Operations, later he became Executive Vice-President and ultimately Chairman of the Board in 1980; and
- WHEREAS: Dimitri was a leader and co-founder of the Massachusetts High Technology Council and served on President Reagan's Commission on Industrial Competitiveness, an appointment which came about due to the impression received by the President upon reviewing the operation of Millipore in 1983; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Sybil Coe d'Arbeloff and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
