- WHEREAS: Many of the restaurants, businesses, and cultural organizations in Central Square represent and celebrate the cultural and ethnic diversity of the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: This year the Cambridge Arts Council is presenting the first Cambridge International Fair: "Walk the World in Central Square" to highlight the City's rich heritage; and
- WHEREAS: This fair will take place on June 8, 1991 from 12 noon until 7 p.m. at University Park in Central Square; and
- WHEREAS: Stretching the entire length of Massachusetts Avenue from Prospect Street to Lansdowne and spilling into University Park, there will be musicians and artists, traditional crafts, ethnic food, and carnival and street performers; and
- WHEREAS: The International Fair will feature such beloved Cambridge performers as: the Cambridge Harmonica Orchestra, Revels, the David Azarian Trio, Panorama, Ambassa, Brother Blue, Stan Strickland, and many others; and
- WHEREAS: Representatives of the Tsukuba and Yerevan Sister Cities, Concilio Hispano, the Community Art Center, and other Cambridge cultural organizations will be participating in the International Fair through performances and crafts; and
- WHEREAS: The International Fair expresses the rich variety of ethnic cultures in Cambridge and provides performances to reach people of all ages and backgrounds; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council hereby proclaims June 8, 1991 International Day in Cambridge and congratulates the Arts Council for producing the first Cambridge International Fair; and further be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to the Arts Council on June 8, 1991.
