- WHEREAS: Providing additional affordable housing for low-and moderate-income families, including the homeless, remains a top priority for this City Council; and
- WHEREAS: Substantial state funding is necessary for the city's efforts on this subject to continue, especially because of federal withdrawal from funding housing production; and
- WHEREAS: On March 31, the Massachusetts House of Representatives passed H.5218, the 1987 housing production bill that authorizes \$424 million for public and private housing development; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council urge the Massachusetts Senate to act favorably and promptly on H.5218, to ensure continued funding for public and non-profit production initiatives; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk send copies of this resolution to President William Bulger, Senator Patricia McGovern, (Chair, Senate Ways and Means Committee), Senator Frederick Berry (Chair, Housing and Urban Development Committee), and Senators Michael Barrett and Michael LoPresti.
