The committee met on Thursday, September 16, 1976 at 6:00 P. M. and heard from Louise Ciampi representing the petitioner. Ms. Ciampi informed the committee that their establishment was located on the second floor of the premises numbered 56 Boylston Street. She further stated that for the past three years a sandwich type sign placed on the sidewalk was effective in directing people to their second floor establishment and she further stated that she had been informed by a police officer that a permit was required for the sign. In response to questions by the Committee, Ms. Ciampi stated that the sign had a width of thirty-six inches and would be placed near the curb line of the seven foot sidewalk and was necessary for the conduct of the business.

That, in accordance with the provisions of an ordinance relative to placing and maintaining signs, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to Janet Speers, d/b/a Clothware for the erection of a ^{sidewalk sign} ~~sign~~ at 56 Boylston Street, Cambridge.

Provided that, before erecting the above named sign, the petitioner shall obtain a permit from the Building Department and file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge from all claims for damages arising from the construction, maintenance and use of said sign.

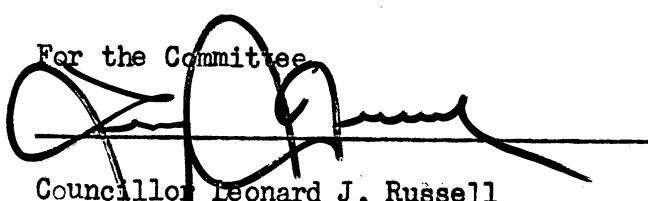

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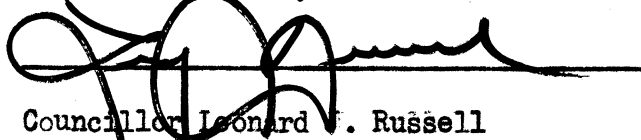
